## DEVELOPMENT PROCESS EASES

Lee County has amended the Land Development Code (LDC) and streamlined application processes by expanding staff's authority to issue variances, reducing review procedures, and revising application requirements. The amendments are available online.

## SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

## HOUSING FINANCE REFORM

A bi-partisan group of U.S. senators is working on a bill to reform the housing finance system, including eliminating Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. The new bill would build on a proposal from the Housing Finance Agency in which a specially chartered financial institution would be created to pool shareholders' capital and guarantee principal and interest payments to mortgage-backed securities holders. The bill is expected to create an explicit government backstop, similar to Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. A lot of the credit risk would be transferred from the entity providing the guarantee to a form of private capital.

# I-HUB FUNDING VETOED

Governor Scott vetoed a \$7.5 million budget allocation for development of the Renewable Energy Research Institute near Florida Gulf Coast University. The Institute the cornerstone of the 241 acre Innovation Hub, a partnership between the school, the community, and private industry.

# LEGISLATIVE RECAP

**Fast-track Foreclosures** - *TO GOVERNOR TO SIGN* HB 87 reduces period to file a deficiency judgement after foreclosure action and provides time limitations for commencing certain activities.

### **Commercial Lease Tax - FAILED**

Legislation (SB656/HB 629) to phase out the sales tax on commercial rental property died in the Senate Commerce and Tourism Committee and the House Finance & Tax Subcommittee.

**Property Taxation**- *SIGNED INTO LAW*HB 1193 deletes requirement that property appraiser must reclassify lands as

**Environmental Regulation** - *SIGNED INTO LAW* HB 999 streamlines environmental permitting, although language restricting fertilizer and wetlands regulations was stripped.

# Affordable Housing - PASSED

Legislators approved SB 1852, allocating monies received in the settlement with national lenders to a variety of affordable housing programs and assistance for those harmed in the foreclosure crisis.

## **Transportation Concurrency - FAILED**

SB 1716/HB 321 died in committees in both houses. Was intended to prohibit local government from applying transportation concurrency or requiring a proportionate-share contribution on small new business development.

**Transportation Development** - *SIGNED INTO LAW* HB 0319 revises provisions for implementing transportation concurrency and providing requirements for alternatives.

**Public Private Partnerships** -TO GOVERNOR TO SIGN HB 85 expands authorized uses and sets guidelines.



## REGULATING AIRPORT WILDLIFE

On June 17, Lee County Commissioners will conduct an adoption hearing for a Comprehensive Plan amendment updating management plans for hazardous wildlife at Page Field and Southwest Florida International Airports. The update affects design of wetland mitigation areas on airport property and nearby private properties. The proposed update may be reviewed on the County website.

# FORECLOSED PROPERTY REGISTRY

Lee County commissioners plan to hear public comment and discuss a proposed ordinance to register foreclosed properties on August 13. The proposal would require all private and institutional lenders to register properties that are vacant and in process of foreclosure or foreclosed. Lenders would be required to pay an annual registration fee, post signs, and inspect and maintain the subject properties. A third party vendor would manage the registry. The <u>draft ordinance</u> is available for review.

# MORTGAGES TRUMP CODE LIENS

The Florida Supreme Court has upheld the priority of a prior recorded mortgage over code enforcement liens. (*City of Palm Bay v. Wells Fargo Bank, N.A.*, Case No. SC11-830, May 16, 2013). The decision provides certainty to mortgage holders that their liens will no be displaced by subsequent code enforcement liens.

## **BUSINESS CLIMATE IMPROVES**

Florida Gulf Coast University and the Horizon Council released the Second Quarter 2013 Business Climate Survey. The business climate index increased from 66 to 71 since the last guarter. Of those responding . . .

- 77% believe that the economy has improved
- 82% say it will improve over the next year
- 63% think there will be an improvement in their own industry
- 54% expect to increase employment in the year ahead
- 57% expect an increase in investments this next year The biggest challenges facing businesses include: workforce, healthcare costs, controlling costs, market & growth, regulations, financing economy and price competition.
