# LEADING P3 AUTHORITIES GATHER FOR REIS WORKSHOP SEPT. 14

Top government and real estate development experts will gather in Southwest Florida September 14<sup>th</sup> to explain opportunities and applications for Public-Private Partnerships (P3s) and how to implement them. The workshop, "Public-Private Partnerships – P3s," is presented by the Real Estate Investment Society (REIS), Lutgert College of Business at Florida Gulf Coast University, Urban Land Institute (ULI), and Lee Building Industry Association (BIA), will take place at at Florida Gulf Coast University.

The program is designed to assist local governments, landowners, developers, lenders, attorneys, design and construction professionals to use P3 strategies to develop projects in Southwest Florida. The interactive panel discussion includes:

# AMENDING STATE CONSTITUTION

The November ballot includes 11 proposed amendments to Florida's Constitution, several of which would affect business and real estate:

Amendment 3 - "State Government Revenue Limitation" would limit revenue collected by the state to the amount collected the previous year plus an annual adjustment based on a combination of population growth and the rate of inflation. Excess revenue would be returned to taxpayers or go to the Budget Stabilization Fund, used to support public education.

Amendment 4 - "Property Tax Limitations" would reduce the annual assessment cap on non-homesteaded property from 10% to 5% and extends the cap to 2023. It also gives first time homebuyers an additional \$150,000 homestead exemption phased over 5 years and allows the Legislature to repeal the "recapture" rule, which can cause taxable values on some homesteaded properties to rise even when market values have gone down.

Amendment 10 - "Tangible Personal Property Tax Exemption would create an additional exemption on tangible personal property valued at more than \$25,000 but less than \$50,000. Counties would also be authorized to provide additional exemptions.

Amendment 11 - "Additional Homestead Exemption" will allow local governments to grant additional homestead exemption equal to the assessed value of the homestead property for low-income senior citizens.

### LEE PLAN AMENDMENTS

Lee County staff is proposing a wide range of amendments to the Comprehensive Plan and the Land Development Code, some of which would impose new requirements on development regarding sustainability, green space, and bike paths. Review the proposals at the Community Development website.

# CHALLENGING TAX ASSESSMENTS

Lee County's Property Appraiser mailed TRIM notices, showing proposed property taxes, in mid-August. If you do not agree with the assessed value of your property, you have only 25 days from the mailing date of the notice to file any challenges.
